



DIRECTOR'S NOTE

There is a draft of this director's note somewhere, which is a little self important, describing how gratifying it is to be making art after the devastation of the past year. It details how the show's themes revealed themselves in ways I never could've predicted over the project's evolution, and you bet it includes a clever and effective metaphor about the ways in which creating a filmed production was the epitome of "a new world." Instead, I'd rather share with you one of the most profound moments I experienced over the course of creating our show.

With three hours to go in our penultimate day of filming, Stars and the Moon was on the slate. About halfway through the song, I knew it would be our final take—it was going too well. Standing behind the camera monitor, I shifted my gaze to watch what was happening beyond the frame. I got emotional at the realization that while I would watch it happen again, I'd never again be watching while it happened. I wished everyone could be there—and in a way, you can be.

It was July 2019 when the Monumental team made the decision to produce *Songs for a New World*. We never could have imagined then that it would take this form (with our audiences left to their own devices) but I am so proud and grateful that our show made its way to you. I hope you enjoy.

THE BAND

Jeff Thurston (Violin), a graduate of Indiana University School of Music, has been an active freelance violinist in the DC metro area since 1994. As an orchestral musician, he has performed most frequently with the Alexandria Symphony Orchestra and the National Gallery Orchestra. As a theater musician, he is most often heard (if not necessarily seen) at Signature Theater, where he has had the good fortune to work with several leading musical theater composers (including John Kander and Michael John La Chiusa), as well as many distinguished orchestrators (including Jonathan Tunick and Bruce Coughlin). He has also played for productions at several other theaters in the area, including Arena Stage, Ford's Theater, and Creative Cauldron. By day he pushes numbers around in the Finance Department at John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts.

Matt Horanzy (Guitar) is a guitarist, composer, and educator currently living in Washington DC. Matt graduated from the University of South Florida with his Masters in Jazz Composition in 2018. Since then, Matt has been a freelance guitarist and educator in the DMV. Matt is the recipient of numerous awards such as the National Band Association Award for Jazz Composition, the ASMAC Bill Conti Award for Jazz Composition, and the New York Youth Symphony Jazz Orchestra Commission. His music has been played by bands such as the Airmen of Note and the NYSS Jazz Orchestra, at venues such as Dizzy's Jazz Club at Lincoln Center. Matt was a member of the BMI Jazz Composers Workshop in NYC for two years, which resulted in a performance of his piece by the BMI Jazz Orchestra. He is on faculty at the Community College of Baltimore County. In his free time, Matt enjoys playing with his dog Charlie.

Jonas Creason (Bass) moved to Virginia in 2009 to attend college at the University of Virginia, where he received a Bachelor's degree in Sociology and an informal education in Southern Living*. After graduating from UVA, Jonas was able to live out his lifelong dream of being in a rock n roll band while touring across the United States and throughout Europe with The Anatomy of Frank. Since moving to the DC Metro area in 2016, Jonas has played in the pit orchestra for several productions with MTC and other theatre companies in the area, which has allowed him to meet incredible artists and justify his growing collection of basses. When he's not playing bass you can find Jonas chugging coffee, puzzling, or searching for the motivation to exercise.

Marty Risemberg (Percussion) is a drummer, percussionist, composer, and educator based in the Washington, DC area. He currently teaches a wide range of students at the International School of Music and The British International School. He has recorded and toured abroad with the jazz fusion trio Swansong and performed internationally with Project Locréa at the Macau Cultural Center. An active musician in the DC scene he collaborates with artists such as Project Locréa, The Hot Lanes Big Band, The Doc Dikeman Big Band, Jonny Grave, and many other artists across a plethora of genres.

THE BAND

Aron Rider (Cello) is a freelance cellist with a focus on musical theatre. Aron has performed at the Arena Stage, Shakespeare Theatre, Signature Theatre, Olney Theater, Roundhouse, National Theatre and Wolf Trap along with multiple local orchestras and ensembles. In chamber music, Aron has participated in several Levine Presents programs, and in the inaugural season of "Chamber Music for the Outer Cape" concert series, Provincetown, MA. Aron's playing has been heard on several cast recordings, as well as on "Joke on the Puppy," (Caroline Mountain Band). Aron is also a Suzuki Cello Instructor, and maintained a full studio of students for many years. She now returns to more extensive performing, retaining only a small number of home students. She received her training at Indiana University and Louisiana State University, studying with Tsuyoshi Tsutsumi and Dennis Parker, respectively.

Sam Carolla (Drums) is an active musician in the greater DC metro area, and a native Virginian. Initially influenced by alternative rock, he started music lessons at 12 and soon became inspired by the sounds of jazz and fusion. Sam has played locally in a variety of styles including rock, pop, indie worship, jazz, big band, and musical theatre. He has performed with many artists including Cat Janice, Oh He Dead, Cristian Perez, Wade Beach, The Peter Edelman Trio, the GMU Jazz Ensemble, GMU vocal jazz ensemble, and many many more."

Sonia Garcia-Lee (Violin), a professional violinist in the DC area, completed her bachelor's degree in violin performance at The National University of her native country, Colombia. She was a member of the Colombia Symphony Orchestra before coming to the US to pursue her master's degree at Temple University in Philadelphia. She has played in numerous ensembles, especially in the Greater Philadelphia and Washington DC metropolitan areas. Over the last decade she's lived in MoCo, MD with her husband and two tweens. Andrew Weaver (Viola) holds a B.Mus. in viola performance and musicology from Rice University and a Ph.D. in musicology from Yale University and is currently Professor of Musicology at The Catholic University of America. He has been continuously active as a violist since graduating from Rice. He has played with orchestras and chamber ensembles at Yale, Northwestern University, and Catholic University, as well as with professional performing organizations in the DC area, including Montgomery College Summer Dinner Theatre, the Great Noise Ensemble, and the Arlington Philharmonic (for which he has served as principal viola). He has also performed opera premieres in the Capital Fringe Festival with Silver Finch Arts Collective.

BETH AMANN Managing Director


