As composer and musical director he collaborated to create White Noise by Michael Hollingsworth, a modern adaptation of The Orestia. He was co-founder and artistic director of Toronto's Buddies in Bad Times Theatre — one of the world's largest gay and lesbian theatres — from 1979 to 1997. He has received three Dora Mavor Moore Awards as well as the Pauline McGibbon Award, and The Silver Ticket Award. There is a street in Toronto named after him: 'Sky Gilbert Lane.' In 2021 Dundurn Press published his 8th novel I, Gloria Grahame. His accessible yet well documented analysis of the appeal of Shakespeare — Shakespeare: Beyond Science: When Poetry Was the World — was released by Guernica Editions in September 2020. His second book about Shakespeare: Shakespeare Lied will be published by Guernica soon. Dr. Gilbert is a professor of theatre at the University of Guelph.
